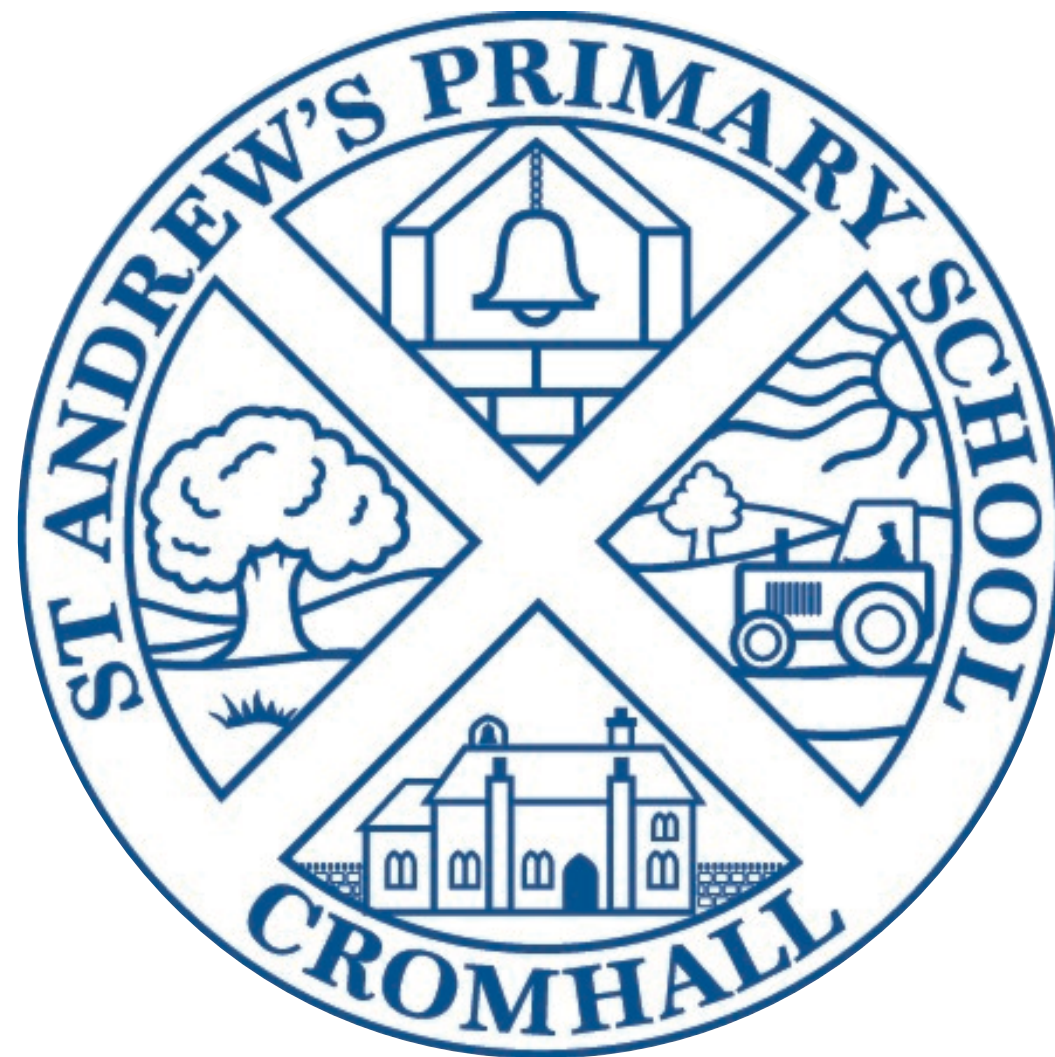

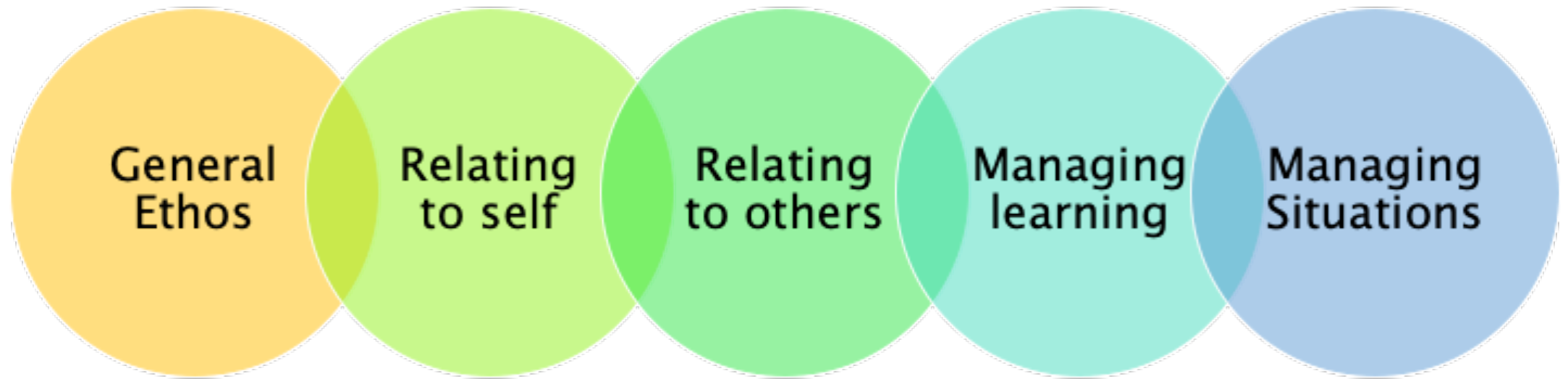

## Curriculum Intent

### Aim

Here at St. Andrew's to help our children achieve the highest possible standard we provide a broad and balanced curriculum that includes real life experiences. Our enriched curriculum promotes the development of creativity, whilst creating enthusiasm for a love of learning and curiosity about the World around us. Pupils develop resilience through fun and practical, varied opportunities that allow for links with other subjects. As a result self - esteem is developed, while knowledge becomes embedded through a well thought out interactive curriculum that is rich in experiences.

### Curriculum Drivers

#### Community

Our small, rural school is unique and special. We take every opportunity to get involved in our village community and that of neighbouring areas. This is evident in our curriculum where learning is linked to our local environment and events which are happening within it. We are privileged to maintain strong links with school alumni, who are often related to our current pupils. This enables us to learn from real people. The relationships within our school, between both adults and children, are strong and valued. Our curriculum allows for collaboration between key stages as children build on and share prior learning with their peers. Older children are used as 'experts' to share their experiences and learning with younger children, demonstrating embedded learning from previous years. Our whole school themes allow us to make the most of shared opportunities, e.g. shared experts, visitors and external visits.

Building on our children's understanding of our local community, we strive to educate them about the wider world and global issues. Our curriculum ensures our children develop as global citizens with confidence, curiosity, resilience and humility.

#### Spirituality

At St. Andrew's we value our links with both our local church and chapel. We regularly work in partnership with both to provide collective worship opportunities for the whole school community. Key dates in the Christian calendar enable us to come together to share learning and demonstrate children's understanding of these events. Our proximity to both the church and chapel allow us to use their facilities to enrich the children's learning experiences. The church and its surroundings are a key part of our local history and provide many learning opportunities.

Our learners are equipped with the desire to consider life's big questions, wonder about life and debate possible answers. They develop a sense of belonging and understanding of their place in the world.

#### Creativity

Our creative curriculum strives to give our children a wide variety of experiences both in and out of the school environment to build on those they already have. As a school, we are aware that not all children have the same opportunities and go all out to ensure that their school life is as rich and diverse as possible.
